Beginning to Take Next Steps from the Long-Range Plan

The Long-Range Plan - *Be Different, Be Bold, Be Better* —was completed this summer by a planning team after conducting a series of focus groups with members of the congregation. Since then, the Diaconate has discussed the findings and recommendations, and members of the congregation took part in two Zoom discussion sessions about the plan. We are now beginning to address the Next Steps specified in the plan.

In September the Diaconate approved working on six next steps. These are:

- Pastoral Transition Pastor Tim is retiring in February 2022, and we need to begin a search for a new pastor soon.
- Facilities We need to determine how to address several issues with our current buildings, including findings of a seismic study, lack of parking, and significant issues related to accessibility.
- Senior Ministry Build on efforts currently underway to reinvigorate our ministry to seniors.
- Anti-Racism Begin the effort to become an anti-racist church.
- Small Group Ministries Create a broad-based small groups ministry.
- Governance Identify and propose to the congregation for approval changes to our Bylaws regarding governance at SFBC.

The Executive Committee has also agreed to form a Program Office to coordinate work relating to the plan and to help the congregation process change. Jim Segaar and Joyce Phillips have volunteered to work as the Program Office beginning now. Other resources may be added as we move forward.

It is important to remember that the only decisions that have been made to date are to begin work on these tasks. No decisions specific to the pastoral transition, facilities, or any of the other topics have been made. We are at the beginning of what will be a multi-year transformation. It is critical that the congregation be involved in all these discussions and decisions as we move forward. Taskforces are being formed to work most of these next steps.
