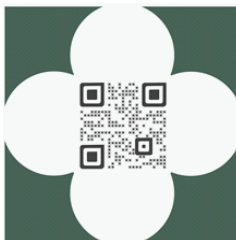

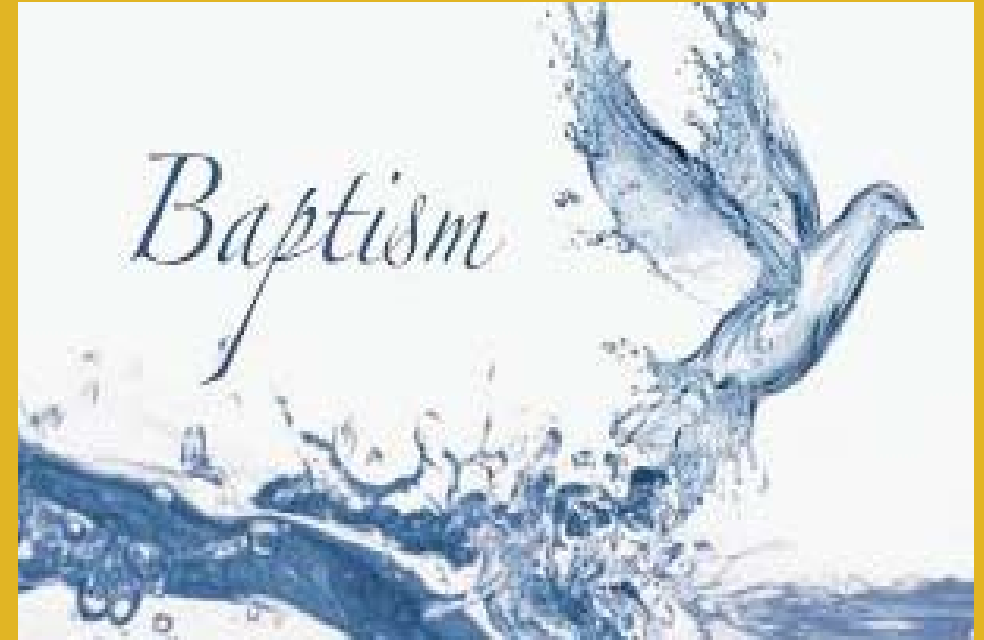

Worship Notes: The celebration of the ministry of Rev. Dr. Timothy Phillips and Patrick Green has been scaled back because of the increase in COVID transmission with the omicron variant. The program that was originally planned for January 30 will be presented in the SFBC sanctuary immediately following worship on February 6, which is Pastor Tim and Patrick’s final Sunday with us. Both worship and the program will be live-streamed on our website and on Facebook for those who choose not to attend in person.

If you do attend in person on February 6, please follow the guidelines below. To ensure the safety of everyone attending, there will be no exceptions to these guidelines:
•Attendees must be fully vaccinated INCLUDING a booster shot. Proof of vaccination, a booster shot, and a valid ID must be presented to gain admittance to the sanctuary. •N95, KN95 or KF94 masks are required. Masks must be worn at all times while inside the building. Masks will be available at the entrance. •Attendees must sit in designated seating areas that are distributed at safe distances throughout the sanctuary main floor and balconies. •Attendees must practice social distancing before, during and after worship and the afternoon program. •Attendees are asked to exit the building promptly at the conclusion of the program. Please understand these requirements are to keep everyone safe.

New Parking! Poly Clinic is no longer available for parking. Free parking will be available at Harvard Market Parking Garage. The address is 1401 Broadway. The lot entrance is on Broadway just north of the Seneca/Broadway intersection. The entrance gate system is currently out of order. Simply park in the lower garage and sign in at the hospitality desk when you get to the church. This will allow us to have a count so we can pay the garage. Parking is in the UNDERGROUND lot only. Once parked, take the elevator to the top floor and walk towards Harvard. The walk is about the same distance as the Poly Clinic but there is much less of an incline.
