

SFBC COVID Masking Guidance We are so grateful that SFBC has thus far successfully navigated the COVID pandemic with a combination of vaccination, social distancing and masking. For the time being, masks will still be required in all areas of the church on Sunday mornings. With so many attending being elderly and/or in a higher risk category, we feel it is prudent to continue to wear masks through March. If trends maintain a downward trajectory, beginning April 1 masks will no longer be required in the church facilities in MOST areas. Masks may still be required in certain areas where children are present (classrooms, wiggle room, nursery, etc.) This policy will be monitored and adjusted as needed in consultation with the parents of our youngest members.
