Notes for Worship: Welcome to the O'Dea High School choir and their conductor, **Paul Marenco.** Special thanks for their music and spirit in today's worship, and thank you to **Dori Baunsgard** - pianist for the O'Dea High School choir - for reaching out and making the connection for today's service. Amazing Grace - John Newton/New Britain - Son of a shipmaster, John Newton was born in 1725 in London. Becoming a sailor himself, he led an adventurous—and dissolute—life. Returning to England in 1748, his ship was buffeted by a severe storm and in desperation he called out to God. As the storm died down, his conversion to Christianity began and in 1764 he became a priest. While ministering in Olney, Newton wrote Amazing Grace, around New Year's Day in 1773. Written for a poor and uneducated community, only 19 of the hymn's 146 words have more than one syllable. Originally sung to more than 20 melodies, the lyrics were matched by William Walker in1835 to New Britain, a melody comprised of two old tunes. This version gained increasing popularity in the United States and is today the most famous of all folk hymns.
