Worship Notes: Hezekiah Walker is a pastor, gospel artist, singer and songwriter. His choir, The Love Fellowship Crusade Choir has recorded numerous albums and received many awards. He pastors two churches, one in Philadelphia and the other in New York City. Many of his songs are standard repertoire in black churches, including "The Lord Will Make a Way Somehow," O Lord We Praise You," "Power Belongs to God," and "Lift Him Up." In an interview, he describes how being a church musician is not just a job for him, but he strives to live the life that he sings about. When criticized for partnering with some controversial popular artists, Walker states that it is not our job to judge, but instead, it is our job to "bridge the gap" and that requires us to go out into the world to spread the good news.
