Worship Notes: We celebrate the ministry of Companis today and the wonderful impact they have on the community. We welcome them in worship today.

Abide With Me - Henry Francis Lyte/William Henry Monk Born in Scotland in 1793, Henry Francis Lyte was sent to school in Ireland. After becoming an Anglican priest in 1815, he served in several towns in England while raising his family. An accomplished flutist, Lyte also spoke Latin, Greek and French, and, at his last post in Brixham, built one of the largest libraries in England. He wrote the words and a tune to Abide with me shortly before he passed away in 1847. Although Lyte's tune was considered by some as "dull," the hymn was paired in 1861 successfully with another tune, Eventide, by William Henry Monk, who was in mourning for the death of his three-year-old daughter. More recently, the hymn was sung at the 2012 Summer Olympics opening ceremony.
