Advent Theme: Revelations of Joy, Hope, Love, Peace

Dear church family,

Advent is my favorite season of the church year. Maybe that's because I am a December baby. Maybe that's because it is theologically significant to me, with beautiful words like *incarnation* and *awake* and *embodiment* floating around. Or maybe it's because I just love the twinkling lights of the season, making the gray, rainy Seattle days go by. Or maybe it's all of that, together.

Whatever the reason for my love of the season, this year I feel I have been waiting for it to arrive. And that's fitting, because Advent is a time of waiting. But, as our Advent candle-lighting ritual says, this waiting is not passive, sit-around-and-do-nothing waiting. This is waiting with *esperanza*, waiting with *espectant hope*. And for what are we waiting during Advent? For the revelations of God's love to be made fresh among us. Each Sunday in Advent, we will experience the revelations of the season—revelations of joy, hope, love and peace. Revelation, in the Bible, is related to *unveiling*—making that which is hidden plain, and that which is unknown known. I wonder, what will the Holy reveal to you during this season of unveiling?

Throughout the Advent season, you are invited to participate in the Advent Photo-A-Day Challenge. In the Spire and in the church at the Welcome Table, you will find a list of words for each day of Advent that will help you prepare your heart for the revelations of this season. Each day, notice the word of the day.

For so many reasons, winter and the holiday season can be very difficult. I, like many of you, have lost loved ones during this time of year. And so, I urge you to be tender with yourself. Do what you need to do to get through. Remember to rest your body, mind and spirit. If you don't feel joyful, that's ok. Your feelings are valid. You may wish to find a Blue Christmas service to attend or find the Advent Taizé services contemplative and soothing. Please do not hesitate to reach out to me or another friend in the congregation if you need someone to listen to you and hold the complexity of the season with you.

Through these times of transition, the surprises and frustrations, the heartache and pain, the celebrations and life events we've marked together, thank you for being a church. YOU make us a church family; with the love you share and the learnings that grow us all. I am grateful to be in ministry with each of you.

Dear church, Happy Advent. Merry Christmas. I love you, and I love being your pastor.

# GUEST PREACHER SPOTLIGHT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE BAPTIST PEACE FELLOWSHIP OF NORTH AMERICA BAUTISTAS POR LA PAZ

**Rev. Jason Smith** has been a part of churches, movements and small groups of people committed to changing the world. After participating in the 2017 Peace Camp in Toluca, Mexico, and experiencing a truly spiritual moment with other peacemakers, he was deeply called to join BPFNA~Baptists for Peace as a peacemaker.

Previously Jason served remotely as director of strategic donations for Sojourners, working to strengthen relationships with major donors and building support for Sojourners. Before this Jason was a development specialist with the Alliance of Baptists; he also served as adjunct professor at the Sutton School of Social Sciences at the Ouachita Baptist University. Jason also works in ministry as a part-time pastor for the First Presbyterian Church, Arkadelphia, and preaching at the First Presbyterian Church, Gurdon, Arkansas.

Jason completed postgraduate studies at the Wesley Theological Seminary ('14, M.Div.) in Washington, D.C., where he focused on urban ministry. He was ordained at Calvary Baptist Church in D.C. in 2014. He's a member of the board of directors of Interfaith Arkansas. He's also served on the board of BPFNA~Bautistas por la Paz.

Jason grew up in Costa Rica as the son of Baptist missionaries. He continues participating in special collaborative projects with communities of faith in Latin America, including Cuba, El Salvador, Mexico and Panama. He and his spouse, Myra, live in Arkadelphia, Arkansas, where Myra is an associate professor of history in the Baptist University of Ouachita with an emphasis in the legal and constitutional history of South Africa. They have four children and share their home with a dog and a cat. For fun, Jason travels, watches Ted Lasso, cheers on the Little Rock Rangers and tries to play the piano like Elton John.

#### ADVENT TAIZÉ SERVICES



The Taizé Community is an ecumenical Christian monastery in Taizé, Burgundy, France. It is composed of more than one hundred brothers from Catholic and Protestant traditions, who hail from over thirty countries. They live simply, and make their home available to visitors from all over the world. Young people, especially, flock to this place in search of spiritual nourishment and peace. Our own Pastor Anita spent some time there. This community has composed, over time, a large body of contemplative music designed to help the participant commune with the Sacred, each in their own way.

Here at SFBC, we have hosted a number of Taizé services over the years. Those who participate speak of finding moments of peace in the midst of their otherwise chaotic or stressful lives. Pastor Anita will be hosting such services on Thursday evening during Advent. No sermons, no announcements—just quiet time singing/chanting together, listening to sacred texts and engaging in prayer and reflection. Consider joining us for this brief weekly time of contemplation and community during the Advent season. Come experience the Sacred.



#### FACILITIES TASK FORCE UPDATE **NOVEMBER 2022**

The long-range planning Facilities Task Force has completed nearly two years of work aimed at ensuring that our property and buildings support our mission, core programs and activities. That work has resulted in a partnership currently with Meriwether and Associates, who on our behalf — with approval of the Council of Ministries and encouragement of the congregation at our July forum — sent out a Request for Interest (RFI) to determine what appetite there might be in the development community for partnering with us in redeveloping our property, if the congregation so chooses.

We are now waiting to hear what the response to the RFI has been, and the Council of Ministries has asked the Task Force to continue in operation to receive and evaluate any partnership interest and report on it to the Council. The Council, in turn, will assess any proposals in light of our community's Mission and Values to see if any development options provide a path for ministry going forward, considering the size, energy and financial capacity of our congregation. We are always grateful for questions or input.
