Love Divine, All Loves Excelling was written by one of the founders of the English Methodist movement, Charles Wesley, in 1743. To call Wesley a prolific hymn writer would be an understatement; experts put his poetic and hymn output between 3,000 and 6,000 verses. Frequently he would be struck with inspiration while on horseback and take down notes while riding. Upon reaching his destination, Wesley would rush inside a friend's home crying, "Pen and ink! Pen and ink" and scribble down his verse. Today's hymn, *Love Divine, All Loves Excelling*, found immediate popularity because its focus on God as pure unbounded love was unusual at the time. The tune we sing, BEECHER, was composed for this text in 1870 by John Zundel, the organist at abolitionist Henry Ward Beecher's Plymouth Church in Brooklyn.

Thomas A. Dorsey (1899–1993), "the father of gospel music," won renown as a blues pianist, the first publisher of black Gospel music and the founder of the National Convention of Gospel Choirs and Choruses. In 1932 Dorsey was inspired to write *Precious Lord, Take My Hand* by the death of his wife in childbirth and his infant son two days later. In composing the melody, Dorsey fused sacred music with blues in adapting *Maitland*, a tune attributed to composer and professor of geology George N. Allen (1812–1877). *Precious Lord* became Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s favorite song and was sung many times at civil rights rallies and later at the funerals of King himself, President Lyndon Johnson and Mahalia Jackson, whose career Dorsey had helped launch. Published in more than 40 languages, the hymn has been recorded since 1937 by innumerous artists.
