About the Installation Stoles by Kris Garratt

When Pastor Anita expressed interest in having new stoles created for the installation on Epiphany Sunday, I was intrigued. When she suggested the imagery for the stoles focus on women in ministry, I was flummoxed. Fortunately, a quote I read shortly thereafter in Sojourner Magazine became the framework for a design. In its article entitled Eleven Christian Women Shaping the Church in 2021, Kat Armas, a Cuban American author and podcaster, states, "Women carry medicina (medicine) in their bodies, their hands and their hearts. Our collective voices and the divine, sacred wisdom that we hold from the women who came before us are necessary to heal a world plagued by injustice, pain and death." Care, healing and support for our community and our world are portrayed at the top of each stole by the church logo cradled in cupped hands, with Spirit hovering overhead. The gift of wisdom from women of the past is portrayed at the bottom of each stole with images of Mary, Phoebe and Cerula. Above them are more contemporary figures such as Jarena Lee, the first female preacher in the A.M.E. Church, and May C. Jones, who was ordained at SFBC in 1882. Above the historical figures are unnamed contemporary women, offering communion and baptism on the foundation of women in ministry who came before them.

About the baptistry art by Dave Roberts

How does a weary world rejoice? In the paper art piece see a sun that is a constant we can depend on, no matter the weather externally or internally. It helps sustain the growth that surrounds the main feature of the piece. Branches hold peace and love and new growth. There's a symbol of Christ's invitation to all to come to the table, represented by a goblet and a cross. New life is surrounded by care and nurture, with the seed of new life coming to those who nurture as well. Probably more difficult to see at a distance is a scale of justice and the words "Hope," "Joy," "Life," and "Holy," all of which provide avenues for rejoicing if we choose to see them.

Rev. Joy Martinez-Marshall serves as the pastor of First Baptist Church of Lincoln, NE and as the Interim Associate Region Minister to Mission Development for the American Baptist Churches of Nebraska. Joy grew up in The Colony, TX. Now, she calls Nebraska home after moving from Waco, TX where she served as a Student Life Minister. She holds a B.A. in Religion from Baylor University and a M.Div. from George W. Truett Theological Seminary. FBC Lincoln shares in ministry with 2 other congregations (Lincoln Karen Baptist Church and Livingstone Christian Church) that call 1340 K Street their home. As pastor, Joy helps lead K Street Lunch, a sack lunch ministry in partnership with FBCL's sibling congregations, other nonprofits, and a local retirement community. Joy serves as the Vice President of the Faith Coalition of Lancaster County and on the Board of Directors of Baptist Women In Ministry. She is committed to helping the local church partner with what God is already doing in the neighborhood while encouraging creative ministry. Joy loves to cook and knows the value of the perfect game day snack. She and her husband, Austin, are avid sports fans and readers.

Rev. Heather Mustain is Associate Pastor at Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas, TX. She leads Wilshire's missions and advocacy work, engaging congregants in missions experiences locally and globally, and equipping the church to be advocates on issues of justice. Heather is a graduate of Baylor University, where she earned a master of social work degree and a master of divinity degree from George W. Truett Theological Seminary. She earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from the University of Colorado at Boulder.
