And it happened at that time she became ill and died and they washed her and laid her in a room upstairs. Now Lydda was near Joppa so the disciples who heard that Peter was there, sent two people to him urging, "Without delay, come to us." Then Peter got up and went with them; when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. And standing beside him were all the widows, weeping and displaying the tunics and other clothing that Dorcas made while she was with them. Then Peter put all of them outside, and got on his knees and prayed, and he turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, arise." And she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter she sat up. Then he gave her his hand and raised her up and calling the saints and widows, he presented her alive. Now this became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Messiah.
